Preparing to Pray

On October 4, our Church celebrates the feast of St. Francis of Assisi. In the Faith-Filled People section of the *Stories of God's Love* Kindergarten website, you will find a story about St. Francis. Read this story to your child, relating how Francis wrote a song, also called a "canticle," praising God for his gift of creation. Explain that Francis felt so close to nature that he called the sun, wind, air, and fire "Brother" and he called the moon, stars, and water "Sister." He called the earth "Mother." Invite your child to celebrate God's gift of creation by repeating each line of the prayer below.
